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SECTION 1 – HOW TO APPLY for SEDA (Sporting Excellence and Development Academy)

Step 1 - Application forms can be accessed through the school website (SEDA link) or Student Reception office.

Step 2 – Complete the application form with all relevant information, including club sport history, school sport history, and any representative sport information.

Step 3 – Include copies of any relevant documentation, certificates and letters of reference to support your application.

Pre-requisites:

It is a requirement that applicants know the rules and have foundation skills in their chosen sport. Playing in club or at representative level will benefit your application.

SECTION 3 – STANDARDS & EXPECTATIONS

3.1 Academics

- > All students must maintain a minimum of 'Good' standard for academic 'Application' in all subjects.
- > All students must maintain a minimum of 'Good' standard for 'Study Practices' in all subjects.
- > All students must maintain a minimum of 'Good' standard for Pastoral Care 'Approaches to Learning'.
- > All students must maintain a minimum 'C' standard for 'Academic Achievement' in all subjects.
- > All students are expected to submit every assessment piece to the best of their ability, by the due date, without exception.

All of the above points are linked with the College Code of Conduct and Assessment Policy.

3.2 Conduct

All students are expected to maintain an exceptional level of behaviour both in and out of the classroom.

- > All students must maintain a minimum of 'Good' standard for 'Behaviour' in all subjects.
- > All students must maintain a minimum of 'Good' standard for 'Punctuality' in all subjects.
- > All BSC referrals during class time or break time will be followed up and subject to section 3.5.
- > When SEDA students are off-campus representing the College, they are to be respectful and compliant in their behaviour including game conduct, language and remaining with the coach.



3.3 Uniform

Students are expected to:

- Wear their College formal uniform correctly and appropriately at all times.
- Wear their full and correct sports academy training kit for all training and trial sessions.
- The sports academy training kit is not to be mixed with the HPE sport uniform.
- Be changed out of their sports academy kit either at the end of the lesson or the next available break.
- Use the correct College backpack at all times except when attending academy class or training where they can use the approved sports bag, any other bags will be considered a breach of uniform.

3.4 Representation

- All students are required to be available to represent the College in the specific competitions for the respective sport as outlined in Section 2.
- All students are required to trial for the Pacific District Representative Team in their respective sport and if selected are required to continue on through Regional, State and National representative teams.
- All students are required to trial to represent the College in the Rivers Championship Tournament and continue to represent the College through all progressive stages.
- When representing the College in any and all competitions, students are required to adhere to policies outlined in section 3.2 and 3.3.

3.5 Attendance

- All students are expected to maintain a minimum of 80% attendance at school. Extended and or repeated absences need to be supported with a doctor certificate or similar.
- Students in breach of this minimum requirement will be removed from training, SEDA class and competitions until the attendance is at an acceptable level.

3.6 Demerit Point System

All students will be provided with 15 demerit points at the beginning of each semester. These demerit points can be deducted for a variety of infringements and subsequently affect a student's enrolment in SEDA.

There are FIVE strike levels and each level consist of 3 points. The type of infringement will dictate the number of points deducted. The break-down of points consists of:

1 point	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• uniform infringement• not ready for training within 5 minutes of start time• application/ study/ practices/ punctuality/ behaviour below "Good"• use of mobile phone between the hours of 8:35am – 3pm• not having a charged laptop for theory lessons
2 points	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• BSC referral (during class or break time)• Failing to bring Academy training kit for Academy training sessions and competitions• non-participation/attendance in training, trials or competitions without valid documentation (for example: an injury not supported by a note or doctor certificate) <p>NOTE – every participant is expected to attend training and competitions regardless of injury.</p>
3 points	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• suspension (plus banned for 2 weeks of training and miss the next competition)• community service• non-submission of assessment• cases of plagiarism



At each strike level students will be addressed in the following format:

Level 1 & 2 – An email to the student and parents/guardians to inform them of their infringements and strike level.

Level 3 – First formal warning. An email will be sent to parents/guardians informing them of the level change.

Level 4 – Second and final warning. An email will be sent home to parents/guardians informing them of the level change.

Level 5 – Removal from academy (and cancellation of scholarship, if applicable).

SECTION 4 – LEVY

The cost of the levy is \$200 per student, per year. This levy will include a training kit and competition entry fees. Levies will be included with school fees.

SECTION 5 – SCHOLARSHIPS

A limited number of scholarships are available to selected students upon satisfying specific sporting and academic criteria. These scholarships range in levels and are subject to students adhering to the terms and conditions. Application forms are available upon request.

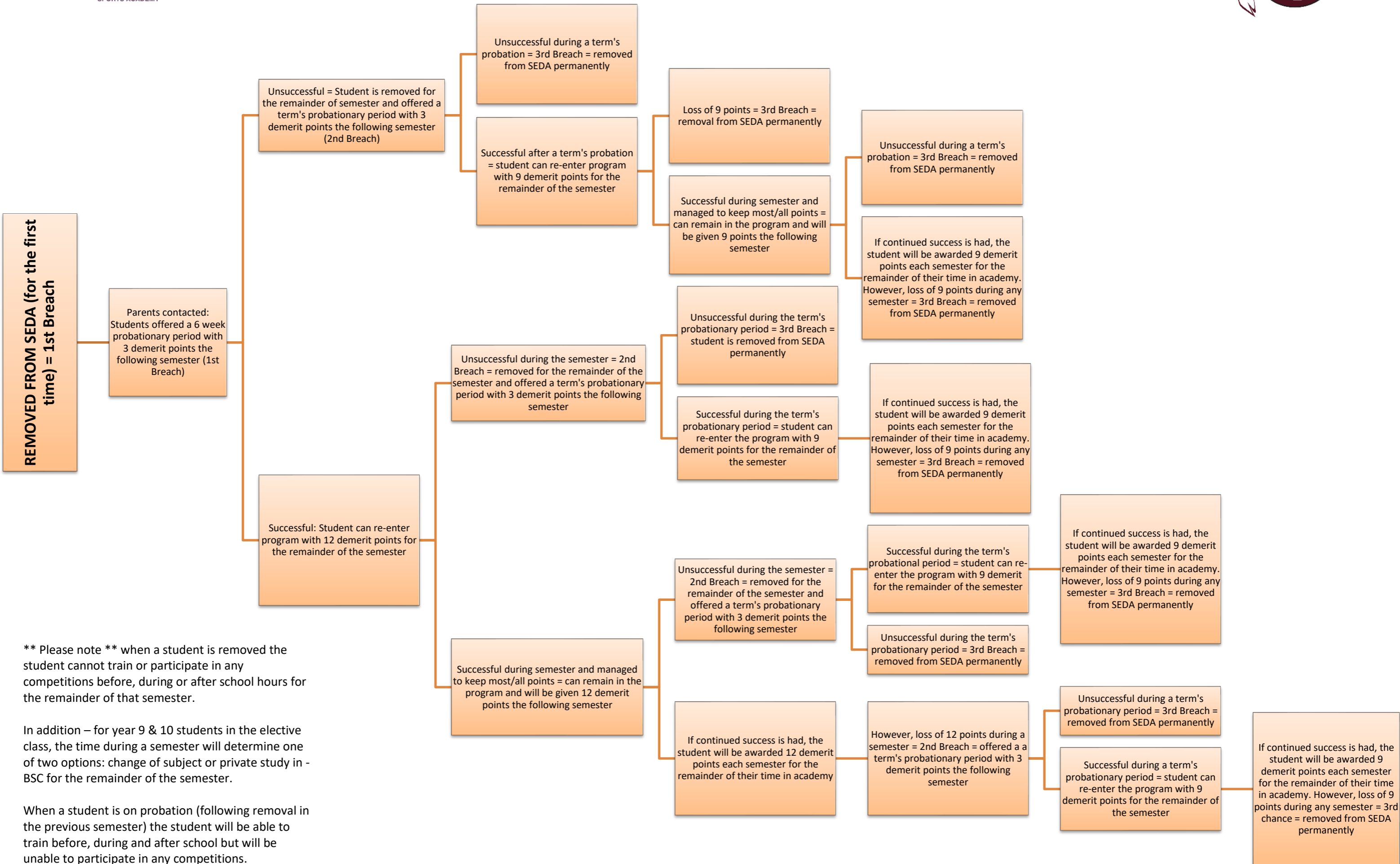

**** Please note **** when a student is removed the student cannot train or participate in any competitions before, during or after school hours for the remainder of that semester.

In addition – for year 9 & 10 students in the elective class, the time during a semester will determine one of two options: change of subject or private study in - BSC for the remainder of the semester.

When a student is on probation (following removal in the previous semester) the student will be able to train before, during and after school but will be unable to participate in any competitions.
